This is probably the first “all 8 Star Energy Rated” development in Victoria that aims to provide affordable housing with high energy efficiency. These homes have been designed with sustainability in mind and features include north sun into living or kitchen areas, low energy lighting and double glazing. All helping to reduce the homes running costs.

Active Cooling

- Living or kitchen areas oriented to the North
- Designed with sustainability in mind – small footprint
- Insulated enviro-crete concrete slab (to R 1 level)
- External structure from brick and low embodied energy light weight Colourbond cladding, internal plaster
- All party walls well insulated with quality acoustic insulation
- Wall insulation to R2.5
- Ceiling insulation to R6 providing excellent thermal efficiency
- Clear double glazing (argon gas filled) with aluminium frames
- Eaves to provide protection and window shading
- Colourbond 'shell grey' (light colour) roof
- Low VOC paints throughout
- Flooring, tiles and carpet to some areas
- North facing windows for solar heat gain in winter
- Reverse cycle Daikin zoned heating
- Eaves providing shade to windows
- Reverse cycle Daikin zoned cooling

- Parks and sporting facilities – 50m
- Hospital – approx.. 500m
- WondongaTown centre – 1 km
- Schools – within 1 km
- Supermarket – within 1km
- Post office and regional train station within 1 km
